April-May Transition — 5 Systems, 7 Weeks, Zero Late-May Losses

Why these six weeks determine your entire Indian summer harvest

THE 5 SYSTEMS THAT CHANGE SIMULTANEOUSLY IN INDIAN APRIL

SYSTEM 1 — SOIL TEMPERATURE

32°C

Critical threshold at 5cm depth. Root stress begins. Microbial activity declines. Moisture depletion accelerates. March: 24–28°C → April: 32–42°C.

SYSTEM 2 — DAILY WATER DEMAND

+50–100%

March: 1.5–2L every 36–48 hours. April: 2–3L every 18–24 hours. Evapotranspiration doubles. Adjust every 4–5 days, not weekly.

SYSTEM 3 — SPIDER MITE GENERATION

5–7 days

At 25°C (March): 15–20 days per generation. At 35°C (April): 5–7 days. Colony undetected April 1 → exponential by April 14. White paper tap test every 3 days.

SYSTEM 4 — MONTHLY PH DRIFT

0.3–0.5 units

March drift: 0.1–0.2 units/month. April drift: 0.3–0.5 units/month (3× alkaline input + slowing soil biology). pH 7.4 = iron lockout.

SYSTEM 5 — POLLEN VIABILITY WINDOW

6 AM – 10 AM only

March: full day. April: window narrows as ambient crosses 38°C by 9:30–10:30 AM in most cities. Any hand-pollination or pollinator visit after 10 AM is mostly ineffective.

CITY-BY-CITY THRESHOLD CALENDAR — INSTALL SHADE CLOTH BEFORE THIS DATE

City / Region	Soil 32°C Threshold	Pollen Window Narrows	Shade Cloth Deadline
Delhi / Rajasthan	March 20–28	April 1–8	March 20
Ahmedabad / Surat	March 25–April 3	April 5–12	March 25

Chennai / AP coast	March 28–April 5	April 8–15	March 28
Hyderabad / Madanapalle	April 3–10	April 12–18	April 3
Mumbai (west-facing)	April 5–12	April 15–22	March 25*
Bangalore	April 10–18	April 20–28	April 10
Kolkata	April 5–12	April 12–20	April 3

*Mumbai west-facing: wall radiation creates critical pot temperatures before ambient threshold — install earlier.

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7-Week Transition Protocol — Week by Week

What to test • What threshold triggers action • What action to take

7-WEEK ACTION SCHEDULE (MARCH 25 – MAY 20)

March 25–31 — Baseline Week

Test all 4 systems: Soil pH, 500ml drainage speed, white paper tap test, soil temp at 5cm at 2 PM. Record everything. This is your comparison baseline for the next 6 weeks.

April 1–7 — First Threshold Check

Action triggers: pH drifted >0.3 units → ferrous sulphate correction now. Soil temp >32°C → shade cloth within 3 days. Tap test >5 dots → 3-day neem cycle now.

April 8–14 — Pollen Window

Measure hourly temp: 8 AM, 9 AM, 10 AM, 11 AM. Note when temp crosses 35°C. This is your morning pollination deadline. Complete all hand-pollination before this time.

April 15–21 — Watering Recalibration

Lift test twice in one day: morning after watering + 5 PM. Calculate water loss. If >40% lost in a day → apply 50mm coir mulch + increase watering frequency.

April 22–30 — Root Zone Check

Slide out 3 containers. Any above 65% root coverage → emergency scoring or repot by May 1–5. Do not wait for drainage symptoms to appear.

May 1–10 — Critical Inflection Point

3 tests this week: pH (action >7.0), drainage speed (action >90 sec), tap test (action above trace). Confirm shade cloth over ALL heat-sensitive containers 11 AM–4 PM.

APRIL 1 BASELINE TEST — THE 15-MINUTE TEST THAT SAVES THE SEASON

Test	Method	Action Threshold	Cost
Soil pH	Digital probe in all containers	>7.0 = ferrous sulphate correction today	₹0 (meter already owned)

Drainage speed	500ml water, stopwatch	>90 sec = emergency scoring	₹0
Mite tap test	White paper under branch, 3 taps	>trace dots = 3-day neem cycle now	₹0
Soil temp	Probe thermometer at 5cm, 2 PM	>32°C = shade cloth within 3 days	₹0 (probe already owned)

THE 3 BIGGEST APRIL-MAY MISTAKES & THEIR FIXES

Mistake	What Gardeners Do	Why It Fails	The Fix
Treating April like March	Same watering, same inspection, same fertiliser dose	All 5 systems have changed — March protocols are half-speed for April	April 1 calendar reminder: recalibrate EVERYTHING
Full fertiliser dose in heat	NPK 19:19:19 at same monthly dose	Reduced uptake in heat → excess salt → pH drift → lockout	Reduce dose 50%. Switch to organic kitchen waste fertility
Installing shade cloth after crop loss	Wait until it “feels hot enough”	By the time it feels hot, the pollen flush is already lost — shade cloth is preventive	Install on your city’s deadline date regardless of whether it feels needed yet

RAJAN’S CHENNAI STORY — ONE APRIL 1ST TEST TURNED 3 FAILED SEASONS AROUND

Three failed seasons (2022–2023): Healthy plants in March, flower drop in April, severe mites in May, total loss by June. Every year same pattern with no explanation.

April 1, 2024 baseline test results: pH: 6.9, 7.1, 7.2, 7.4 across four containers | Tap test: 8 dots on one plant (early moderate colony) | Soil temp: 34°C in south-facing containers | Drainage: all acceptable

Three corrections: Ferrous sulphate in pH 7.4 container → pH 6.7 by May 15 | Neem cycle on April 1, 4, 7 → tap

test zero by April 10 | Shade cloth April 3 → soil temp 29–30°C by April 8

"The difference between 2023 and 2024 was not better seeds or better soil. It was one baseline test on April 1st."

QUICK DIAGNOSIS REFERENCE — APRIL–MAY TRANSITION PROBLEMS

Symptom	Distinguishing Feature	Most Likely Cause	First Action
Pale yellow NEW leaves, old green	Only new leaves affected	pH drift >7.2 — iron lockout	Test pH immediately → ferrous sulphate
Wilting by midday despite watering	Wilts 11 AM–3 PM, recovers evening	Soil moisture depletion from heat	Lift test — if light, increase watering + mulch
Flower drop (2–5 per day)	Coincides with ambient >38°C by 10 AM	Pollen sterility from heat	Shade cloth + morning pollination before 9 AM
Stippled bronze leaves	Tap test shows moving dots on paper	Spider mite colony exponential growth	3-day neem oil cycle immediately
Drainage >90 sec for 500ml	Water sits on surface, slow outflow	Root-bound or soil compaction	Slide out → root coverage check
Wilt in wet soil (no moisture deficit)	Soil moist at 5cm, wilting persists in shade	Root zone overheating >38°C	Probe thermometer at 5cm + shade + jute wrap
Fertiliser appears to stop working	Plants not responding despite green colour	pH lockout from accelerated drift	pH test — if >7.0, correct before next fertilise
Brown leaf edges (not tip)	White crust on soil surface	Salt accumulation from increased watering	TDS test → 500ml flush protocol (Day 4)

RECOVERY TIMELINE — WHAT TO EXPECT AFTER APRIL 1ST CORRECTIONS

Week	What's Happening	What You See
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Week 1 April	Baseline tests reveal early issues before any symptoms	Nothing visible — but problems caught 10–21 days early
Week 2 April	pH correction begins; mite cycle interrupted if caught early	Possibly some pale leaves from pre-correction lockout (temporary)
Week 3 April	Heat management in place; watering recalibrated	Plants stress-free through midday — first sign transition is working
Week 4 April	All 5 systems calibrated for summer conditions	Flowering continues; fruit set beginning on early-sown plants
May 1–10	Monitoring at peak intensity; 3 tests per week	Stable appearance; any deviation caught within 3 days
May 11–20	Summer mode confirmed and stable	Harvest begins on early plants; system stable until monsoon
